We are not put on this earth for ourselves, but we are placed here for each other. We are blessed to serve a local hero that gave so much to so many!




# LOOKING FORWARD

Meals on Wheels of Contra Costa, a non-profit organization that has been supplementing the cost of meals and delivery services to seniors in Contra Costa County, for over three decades. Since its inception in 1990, the organization has provided supplemental funding for 8 million meals delivered by the county wide home delivered "Meals on Wheels" program. This year Meals on Wheels of Contra Costa has made a transition from being embedded in the county wide Meals on Wheels nutrition program to externally operating. We continue to be a community-supported non-profit matching government funding. The shift in the operational structure of Meals on Wheels of Contra Costa was necessitated by broader changes within aging services across the nation and the impact of those changes on the Area Agency on Aging (AAA) in Contra Costa County.

Both Meals on Wheels of Contra Costa and Area Agency on Aging recognise the continued need to generate community funding to fill the gap that government funding leaves. Our partnership supports the continues provision of vital meals services to seniors in our community. To achieve this goal, Area Agency on Aging and Meals on Wheels have embarked on a joint transition process allowing the two agencies to be separate in their operations and collaborative in their approach to continue providing services. The transition has not been without its challenges. Meals on Wheels CC has had to significantly ramp up its fundraising efforts to replace the in-kind support that Contra Costa County uses to provide for the agency's operation as well as working to provide support to help prevent the upcoming fiscal cliff that many nutrition providers in our county are facing.

A key to the organization's success in making this transition has been its focus on building strong relationships with individual donors, local businesses, provider partners and Contra Costa County's Area Agency on Aging. Meals on Wheels of Contra Costa has worked hard to create a sense of community and involvement getting back to the core values and purpose of our coalition. The organization's success has been rooted in its ability to communicate the impact of its work to the community. Meals on Wheels of Contra Costa continues to be transparent about the number of meals served and the impact of its efforts on the community. This has helped to build trust and confidence in the coalition's ability to support the county wide meals on wheels services. The transition from government-supported to fully independent and community-funded has lead to significant changes for Meals on Wheels of Contra Costa. However, through hard work and determination the organization has made a successful transition.

## **Ingredients**

#### For the dressing

- large bunch mint
- small bunch coriander
- · small bunch basil
- 1 fat green chilli, deseeded and chopped
- 1 small garlic clove
- 100ml extra virgin olive oil or rapeseed oil
- 2 limes, zested and juiced
- 2 tbsp white wine vinegar
- 2 tsp honey

## Ingredients

#### For the salad

- 400g black beans, drained
- 2 large handfuls baby spinach leaves, roughly chopped
- 500g heritage tomatoes, chopped into large chunks
- ½ cucumber, halved lengthways, seeds scooped out and sliced on an angle
- 1 mango, peeled and chopped into chunks
- 1 large red onion, halved and finely sliced
- 6-8 radishes, sliced
- 2 avocados, peeled and sliced
- 100g feta, crumbled
- handful of herbs (reserved from the dressing)
